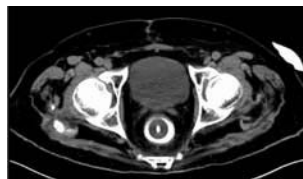


Figure 2 – Cross-sectional computed tomography view showing the bladder catheter balloon located in the rectum, with no contrasting of the bladder.

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
